#### **NEW WORKERS—WELCOME ANN AND IAN**



Understanding these aspects not only ensures the well-being of those being cared for but also establishes a framework for respectful and professional conduct. In addition to this, we had a report from the recent BC Camp addressing how successful the event was, and how it could be improved next year.

Towards the end of the day attendees had a presentation and discussion on results obtained from feedback from both Bethany participants and staff. This was a valuable exercise as it identified areas for improvement moving forward into 2024.









#### **INCLUSION DURING THE CHRISTMAS HOLIDAYS**

Inclusivity during the festive season is important to all Australians and for people with disability, sometimes true inclusion means some adjustments for accessibility.



#### **Key points**

- Not all Christmas activities and events are automatically accessible to people with disability
- Planning ahead and not making a big deal out of any changes made for accessibility can help people with disability to feel more welcome
- It can be important to respectfully ask a visitor whether they need adjustments around Christmas time to facilitate accessibility

Supporting people with disabilities during the holidays involves a mix of understanding, accommodation, and inclusion. Here are some ways to help:

- Accessible Celebrations: Ensure that your Christmas celebrations are accessible. Consider the needs of your guests—like wheelchair access, visual aids, or dietary restrictions—and make necessary adjustments.
- Communication: If someone has specific needs or preferences, ask them directly how you can accommodate them during the celebrations. Clear communication is essential for understanding their requirements.
- Be Inclusive: Include everyone in activities. Adapt games or activities to ensure that everyone can participate comfortably.
- Offer Assistance: Be ready to offer assistance but ask first and respect their preferences. Some might prefer
  to do things independently while others might appreciate a helping hand.
- Create a Calm Space: Loud noises or crowded spaces might overwhelm some individuals. Designate a quiet area where people can retreat if they need a break.
- Consider Food Preferences: Take into account any dietary restrictions or preferences. Have options available for different dietary needs.
- Share Knowledge: Educate other guests about the needs or accommodations that might be necessary. This helps in creating a more understanding and supportive environment.
- Gift Giving: Be considerate when choosing gifts. Some individuals might have preferences or limitations due to their disability.
- Volunteering: Consider volunteering at local organizations that support individuals with disabilities during the holiday season. Your help can make a significant difference.
- Spread Awareness: Use the holiday season to spread awareness about different disabilities and the challenges people face. It helps in fostering understanding and acceptance within the community.
- Remember, the key is to create an inclusive and supportive environment where everyone feels welcome and valued.
